

## **ADVISORY:**

### PUPPIES/KITTENS 8 to 16 WEEKS OF AGE

To protect the health and safety of puppies and kittens, American Humane Society recommends the use of puppies/kittens that are at least 16 weeks of age at the start of the filming process. **Puppies and kittens 8 to 16 weeks must be pre-approved by American Humane Society prior to use.** Please note that puppies/kittens under 8 weeks are not legally allowed to work or travel for commercial purposes per the Animal Welfare Act. An exception may be made for filming animals at their home location in a strict documentary-style format; prior written approval from American Humane Society is required.

#### **IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS:**

- Pre-Approval Process: To obtain approval for the use of puppies/kittens 8 to 16 weeks of age, submit completed application form below with current vaccination records/health certificates to <a href="mailto:filmunit@americanhumane.org">filmunit@americanhumane.org</a>. The completed application form and vaccination records must be received at least 48 hours prior to filming.
- Vaccination Records Must Be Complete: Acceptable vaccination records include veterinary medical/vaccination records, health certificates that include vaccination dates, and breeder-supplied vaccination records that are documented on breeder letterhead. Vaccination records must include the date each vaccine was administered. Records that only include the date the next vaccine is due will not be accepted. When breeders/owners self-vaccinate, documentation of vaccination must include the vaccine label, vaccine serial number, vaccine expiration date and the date the vaccine was given. Rabies vaccinations must be administered by a licensed veterinarian. All records must include the animal's date of birth and current weight.
- **Identification:** Each puppy/kitten must be identifiable by name, sex, breed, and color. Photographs of each animal may be required for identification purposes.
- Vaccination Information: Puppies and kittens that have not received core vaccinations at appropriate intervals are at risk for
  contracting diseases that can cause illness or death. Animals that are not sufficiently vaccinated for their age may be excluded
  from filming. Please keep in mind that vaccines take 14 days to become effective, and vaccines must be scheduled to allow time
  for an immune response before filming. All vaccine records will be reviewed by an American Humane Society veterinarian.
  Vaccination requirements vary by region.
- Overall health: Only healthy puppies and kittens shall be used. American Humane Society strongly recommends that a
  physical examination be conducted by a veterinarian before filming. Inform American Humane Society PRIOR to use of any
  animal with known medical conditions or disabilities or that is currently on any medication. This information must be disclosed as
  part of the approval process.
  - No animal(s) may be used if they are currently under the care of a veterinarian for an infectious disease, receiving medical treatment for a disease, injury, or condition, or showing signs of illness such as nasal discharge, coughing, sneezing, runny eyes, diarrhea, or vomiting.
  - o When traveling across state lines or internationally, a Health Certificate may be required.
- **Parasites:** Parasites cause illness and disease. Puppies and kittens should be tested for internal parasites and examined for external parasites to ensure that they are free of parasites, which could be passed to other animals.
- Mixing kittens/puppies: American Humane Society recommends against mixing litters or using puppies/kittens from different sources. If mixing from different litters or sources, prior approval is required. Prior approval is also required if puppies or kittens will be working with adult animals or with other species.
- **Plan Ahead:** When determining the animal action, consider the age of the puppy/kitten and environmental factors such as weather. Puppies/kittens under 16 weeks old cannot work in snow and subfreezing temperatures, extreme heat, or inclement weather. Puppies and kittens may need additional provisions to stay warm/cool.
  - o Inform American Humane Society and the animal owner/trainer if any props, makeup, costumes, or special effects (such as rain, snow, dust, fog, etc.) and/or any other products that could be ingested or inhaled will be used.

	Documentary Style: Puppies/Kittens, and their mothers must be filmed "Documentary Style". <b>Document requires that there be no interaction between production and the animals or direction from the production.</b> The animals are to be filmed in their own environment doing what they normally would be docurrent caretakers of the animals may handle/touch the animals and only when they would normally han the animals. There must be no rearrangement, staging, or handling of the animals for filming purposes.
